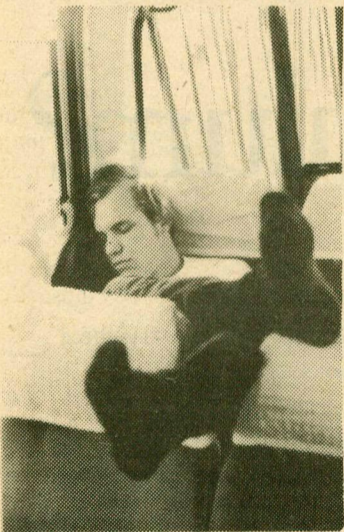
The experience of living with thirty-four people in a foreign country, in a different culture is something that is difficult to relate to people who have not had the opportunity to experience the same situation.
